This past month Beth and I were able to travel to Peru for a ladies conference that she was teaching in, that was titled "Mending the Broken Heart". Then on Sunday I was able to preach in two different churches before we headed back to Bolivia on Monday. As we have mentioned in the past, our school schedule here is backwards from that of the US, so the school year starts in February and ends in December. So, with the new school year staring this past month, we decided to try and reach out into the community by preparing and giving out bags with the school materials that the students needed. Here in Bolivia, each students is required to buy their own supplies, including; paper, pencils, glue, crayons, scissors, rulers, and many other things. As this can be very expensive, we saw it as a great opportunity to get people's attention. Although we have done this at our other churches, we had not done it at our new church in Chiquicollo; and we did not know what to expect. This activity was headed up by Courtney Mathos, that works with us here in the ministry and some of the other ladies at church. Well the night of, there were around 160 that showed up (they lost count) between both parents and children. Since they prepared one hundred bags they had to ask sixty of them to return the next week for their materials. We praise the Lord that both times we were able to share the gospel those who came.

Teacher Training:

As our church has grown, it has been a blessing to see more people with a desire to help in different ministries. We have seen this especially in our children's ministry with those who have a desire to help and teach. This is why Courtney along with my wife Beth had a teachers training time for several weeks on Saturday. We praise the Lord for the ten or so people that participated and are excited about them being able to begin teaching soon.
